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1. Scope

This addendum applies until further notice.

It sets out changes and exceptions to our normal behaviour policy. Pupils, parents and staff should continue to follow our normal behaviour policy with respect to anything not covered in this addendum.

We may need to amend or add to this addendum as circumstances or official guidance changes. We will communicate any changes to staff, parents and pupils.

2. Expectations for pupils in school

2.1 New rules

When students are in our school, we expect them to follow all of the rules set out below to keep themselves and the rest of the school community safe. We will ensure they are given a Health and Safety training when they arrive at the school so that they are clear on expectations. Parents/Carers will be made aware via a letter and agreement called "Protective Measure Plan" and "Protective Measure Agreement". Parents/Carers will be asked to sign the agreement to acknowledge their agreement.

Staff will be familiar with these rules and make sure they are followed consistently. This will be an important part of staff inset prior to student arrival.

Parents should also read the rules and ensure that their children follow the new procedures that have been put in place. Parents should contact Mrs Mead if they think their child might not be able to comply with some or all of the rules, so we can consider alternative arrangements with them and support them to integrate back into school life.

We have added the following expectations in light of the Covid-19 Pandemic. This is in addition to the current Behaviour for Learning policy.

Students will be asked to politely adhere to the following:-:

- Please make sure you leave 2 metres between arriving and leaving students and yourself
- Please ensure you wash and sanitise your hands regularly, including as you arrive, before and after eating and going to the toilet and after handling school games and equipment. Use sanitiser sensibly and appropriately and only on your own person.
- As we are one bubble, you may socialise and play games and sports with other students
- You must remain 1-2 meters away from adults in school
- Ensure any sneezes or coughs are caught in tissues and put in the bin ('catch it, bin it, kill it') and avoid touching your mouth, your nose and your eyes with hands. There must be no attempt to put used tissues near any other staff or student member, even as a joke. Matters of this nature will be treated seriously
- Please tell an adult immediately if you are experiencing symptoms of coronavirus, even if you are unsure

- Please do not share any school lesson equipment. You must bring in the basic equipment such as pens and pencils that you will need to work.
- At no time must you cough at or spit on another person, even as a joke.
- At no time must students make Covid-19 the subject of rumour, bullying, shouting out or attempted humour. We work hard to keep students safe and this will be treated as an attempt to undermine our control measures to keep you safe.

2.2 Rewards and sanctions for following rules

To help encourage pupils to follow the above rules, we will ensure you are reminded and acknowledged for playing your part in keeping our community safe.

However, if pupils fail to follow these rules, we will ensure you work separately from the group until a parent/carer arrives for a meeting on how the situation can be rectified. Host schools will also be notified. If behaviour continues then your place at St Peer's Centre could be jeopardised.

3. Expectations for pupils at home

3.1 Remote learning rules

If pupils are not in school, we expect them to follow all of the rules set out below.

Parents should also read the rules and ensure their children follow them. Parents should contact Mrs Mead if they think their child might not be able to comply with some or all of the rules, so we can consider alternative arrangements with them and support them with their learning.

Students should be:-

- Be contactable during required times (although we will of course take into account that pupils may not always be in front of a device the entire time)
- Work will be set by individual staff but students will be directed to Oak Academy, BBC Bitesize and Google Classroom. This suite of remote learning will ensure broad learning continues despite remote access.
- Complete work to the deadline set by teachers
- Seek help if they need it, from teachers or teaching assistants
- Alert teachers if they're not able to complete work
- Use proper online conduct, such as using appropriate language in messages
- If students are unable to access online work then staff will ensure students receive printed worksheets and textbooks
- Pupils using the National Tutoring Programme to access tutoring are also expected to follow proper online conduct as described above during tutoring sessions.

3.2 Dealing with problems

If there are any problems with pupils adhering to rules around remote learning, including if they don't engage with the remote learning set for them, we will get in touch with students and parents quickly to offer them and the student help and support.

4. Monitoring arrangements

We will review this policy as guidance from the local authority or Department for Education is updated, and as a minimum every 4 weeks in term time by Mrs Mead, Headteacher. At every full review, it will be approved by the full Management Committee.
